
Esther Nofziger Occupational Therapist


Audrey Darby Occupational Therapist

Clientelle includes children with a Visual Impairment alongside other issues including MDVI (Multiple Disabilities with a Visual Impairment), Children with Autism Spectrum Disorders, Sensory Processing Disorder, Cerebral Palsy, Anxiety disorders, and a range of other challenges.
